MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIR – E.H. (Ed) de Caux, Chairman

The 2001/2002 Training Year is underway and with the completion of the Annual General Meeting we will be getting on with the business of the day. Congratulations to all annual award recipients.

Thanks for your confidence in me and our new Board. We have good people involved and, in my opinion, we will continue to grow as we have these last few years. We, the Board, are here to serve you, the members, so I look forward to hearing from you throughout the year.

I have two main goals for the next year -

- Increasing our membership by eliciting the support of ex-cadets and community members to ensure more continuity in coming years; and
- Developing a business plan to map out the next three to five years of operations to enable more long-term planning.

There are other activities in hand. Some of you may be aware that for several years we have been developing a fund, through specifically directed donations, to add to our glider fleet. We have reviewed our gliding program and have concluded that one of the reasons we have not reached our mandated goal, to fly all cadets, is that our aircraft resources are too limited given the operational disruptions forced upon us by weather. An additional glider at Brandon will permit a more efficient operation at that site and add significantly to the number of flights possible when weather does permit us to fly. We are approaching the point where our Gliding Committee can start looking for an additional glider. Subject to cost and DND concurrence, we may be able to make that procurement in the near future.

The national committee is developing a training program for sponsoring groups that explains the League's organization to new members, to some of us older members as well. The intent is to ease the individual into the program and give guidance to the administration demands that we must live with. This program should be available for

presentation to our squadrons in the coming year. We will do this through the Sponsor Liaison Committee.



We have to pay extra attention to ensure that our cadets and members are aware of our roles in this program. We will take some steps in that direction in the coming year. Adding the word Manitoba and the Air Cadet League crest to our aircraft markings is a start. This Newsletter and perhaps a web page will help us to communicate our activities more effectively.

I do look forward to the coming months and hope that with your cooperation the Air Cadet Program in Manitoba will continue to grow and continue to develop the quality cadets that have been our product in the past. We are here for the cadets; without them there is no need for the provincial committee or for sponsors. This organization is all about Air Cadets.

I give a sincere thank you to all the supporters of the Manitoba Air Cadet Program, the members, the sponsors, the military members (regular force and reserve), the parents and all other interested people. Please, continue what you are doing, thank you all.

2002 SELECTION BOARDS

Application documentation for the 2002 Selection Boards has been mailed to the Squadrons from the National Air Cadet League of Canada Office in Ottawa. It is our intention to hold Selection Boards for the 2002 Summer Training Program on February 23 & 24, 2002 at the Western Canada Aviation Museum in Winnipeg. It is most important that all cadets are given the opportunity to apply for summer training, although each Squadron will have to prioritize the applicants that are submitted for the Boards' consideration.

To short-change the process does not help your cadets therefore, please follow all instructions and ensure all documentation is included. It has proven beneficial for cadets who are appearing before the boards to be given some preparation at their Squadron prior to the interviews. Cadets that have not undergone the interview process in some form are at a distinct disadvantage.
