ACLC POST-SECONDARY SCHOLARSHIP AWARDS

Two Post Secondary Scholarships are now available from the Air Cadet League of Canada for qualified Air Cadets. The Leonard and Kathleen Birchall Award/Scholarship and the Robert and Mary Dale Award are open to students that are members of the Royal Canadian Air Cadets during the year of application, and it is awarded on the basis of Secondary School scholastic achievement, combined with outstanding performance as an Air Cadet.

The amount of the awards will be determined annually, and it will be dependent upon the earnings of the investment trusts donated by the Birchalls and Dales. It is expected that the awards will be in excess of \$1000. A recipient may receive the awards once only.



Air Commodore Leonard Birchall (photo left), CM, OBE, DFC, OO, CD, the World War Two hero described by Sir Winston Churchill as the 'Saviour of Ceylon' and a long-time supporter of Air Cadets passed away in Kingston, Ontario on September 10, 2004. At the Semi-Annual General Meeting of the Air Cadet League of Canada in Ottawa in November, Mrs. Kathleen Birchall presented the League Chairman, Mr. Guy Albert, with a donation for the Air Commodore Leonard and Kathleen Birchall Award/Scholarship Fund for post-secondary education for deserving Air Cadets. PREPARATION FOR SUMMER TRAINING SELECTION BOARDS

The 2005 National Summer Training Course Selection Boards will be held on Saturday February 26, 2005 at Building 135, 17 Wing Winnipeg, MB; and it is anticipated that preparations at participating squadrons should be well underway. Squadrons are encouraged to conduct practice interviews for their cadets who will be competing for selection to the National Summer Training Course of their choice.

Cadets should be conversant with topical current events, as well as, the structure of the Air Cadet Organization, both the military and civilian sections. Also, those responsible for application submissions should be familiar with the process and the data offered in the ACLC (MB) By-laws, Policies and Procedures Manual. While applications for the Power Pilot & Glider Pilot Scholarship Courses were to have been submitted by January 31, 2005 and applications for the IACE, Senior Leaders, Air Traffic Control, Technical Training, Athletic Instructor and Survival Instructor Scholarship Courses were to have been submitted by January 18, 2005 late submissions will be allowed until February 15, 2005.

CONTINUATION FLYING TRAINING AWARDS

The Continuation Flying Training Award is a monetary award of \$300.00 available to cadets who have completed the Power Pilot Scholarship training. Two Manitoba Air Cadets have been selected as recipients of this year's awards. Sgt Hendrik Venter of 317 RCACS Strathclair, MB and Sgt Mathew Grabau of 573 RCACS Winnipeg, MB are the recipients. Sgt Venter's award is from the Air Force Association of Canada. Sgt Grabau's award is from the Soaring Association of Canada and in addition he has been awarded the Winnipeg Flying Club's award of an additional \$300.00. Well done, gentlemen.

SECONDARY SCHOOL CREDITS

Manitoba Education and Training will recognize the recording of up to two credits on a student's transcript for work completed by Manitoba students actively involved in the Manitoba cadet programs. The conditions for recognition are as follows:

- One credit can be recognized on the basis of successful completion of the cadet basic training program. Basic training program for Air Cadets is defined as successful completion of the Level Two program;
- An additional credit can be recognized on the basis of successful completion of the cadet advanced training program. Advanced training program for Air Cadets is defined as successful completion of the Level Four program;
- To report this credit for student record purposes the code #9982 is to be used; and
- These credits will be recognized only as additional credits beyond the minimum credits for school graduation.

Commanding Officers have been directed to provide those cadets who wish to participate in this program with a letter to the school principal indicating which level the cadet has attained.

Prevention Program of our partners, the Canadian Forces. This issue is a responsibility of all participants of the Air Cadet Program; Check it out!
