NEW SQUADRON BADGE

The new squadron badge for 263 (Intrepid) RCACS Melita has been officially approved. The squadron is named after Sir William Stephenson, the Canadian spy-master code named "Intrepid".

MEMBER REGISTRATION

Registration and screening of members is proceeding well for those members who are part of the Squadron Sponsoring Committees. Membership cards have been forwarded for those registered. If you have not received a card then we have no documentation on you.

Registration of former squadron volunteers has not been as successful as little documentation has been received as this letter goes to the printer. It is assumed that squadrons have no need of volunteers outside their SSC supporters who have registered. If this is not factual then documentation must be processed before individuals work with cadets.

SQUADRON BADGES

Until the mid 1990's squadron badges were processed and approved by the Directorate of Ceremony at National Defence Headquarters at no cost to the squadron. With the disbandment of the Directorate authority for Air Cadet badges was assumed by the Air Cadet League of Canada's National office.

Unfortunately the cost of processing the designs of the badges has also accrued to the League. Squadron badges now cost approximately \$300 to \$650 depending upon the amount of graphics in the design. Squadrons who are seeking redesign or new badges have had to pay these costs.

The Provincial Committee has decided to assist our squadrons with these costs. Accordingly, we have adopted a plan to cover the costs up to \$1000 per year for new badges for those squadrons presently without official badges. Those seeking redesign of official badges will not be assisted until all Manitoba squadrons have a badge.

Therefore, new squadrons and those without an official badge are invited to forward their design requests to the Provincial office. We will provide assistance on a first come first served basis. If we cannot help in a given year the squadron will be advised and they will have the choice to wait until we can help out or pay for the badge processing themselves.

Thirteen of Manitoba's twenty-three squadrons do not have an official badge. If your unit does not have a badge on the National League web site then you do not have an official badge. Squadron badges are considered an important identifier for the unit members and those without are encouraged to develop a suitable design for their squadrons.



SPRING FAMILIARIZATION GLIDING

Is your squadron getting ready for the Spring Familiarization Gliding program? Do you have an introduction program for your cadets?

Experience has shown that the pre-flight introduction is an important part of the familiarization program. Cadets can have their questions answered which can allay concerns and make the actual flight a memorable experience.

The experience of past years has shown a participation level by cadets much below that expected, therefore let's make 2007 a turn around year and encourage all our cadets to participate.
