GRANT FUNDING REALLOCATION

A DND review of policies and procedures regarding Cadet Program grants, such as the Contingency Grant, Band Grant and Scholarship Grant, revealed that they were not in accordance with Treasury Board financial regulations.

Additionally, the Scholarship Grant did not meet the Cadet Program parameters, nor is there evidence that they affected the retention of senior cadets or caused any increase in enrolment. Accordingly, the decision was made to discontinue the grants as they were and establish a system in which all corps and squadron would each receive a "Budgetary Allocation" in lieu.

The allocation will take into account all former grants, including the scholarship grant, and will provide an opportunity to increase the financial support offered at the squadron level. Working in concert with local sponsors, this will help improve local program delivery – ultimately providing better conditions for the enrolment and retention of cadet members.

Contingency and Band grants for the Training Year 2006-07 have been allocated to squadrons. For future years, Cadet Program Scholarship Grants will no longer be provided by DND. This decision does not affect any program which is sponsored by the Leagues.

The new allocation will be \$15 per cadet based on the average number of cadets registered in FOR-TRESS for each unit in the previous fiscal year; and \$600 per unit registered in Fortress in the previous year. Upon formation of a new squadron not covered above, a lump sum allocation of \$1000 will be allocated, regardless of the number of cadets.

Starting in September 2007, reimbursement of expenses covered by the allocation will be made upon the submission of receipts for expenditures incurred in support of cadet activities and only up to the budgetary allocation entitlement.

CATO 17-34 has been issued that explains the administrative processes and eligible expenditures. Copies may be obtained from your Squadron CO or on the internet at: http://www.cadets.ca/support/ cato-oaic/intro_e.asp?cato=17-34

It is emphasized that the allocation only covers cadet activity expenses and not league generated expenses, such as, assessments or Sponsoring Committee operating expenditures.

SCHOLARSHIPS FOR AIR CADETS

Generous donations from the Honorary President of the Air Cadet League of Canada Mr. Robert Dale and Mrs. Kathleen Birchall, have provided funds for the Robert and Mary Dale and Air Commodore Len and Kathleen Birchall post secondary education scholarships. These are entrance scholarships for any recognized University or College Program in Canada. In 2007 the Dale Scholarship was worth \$2,500 while the Birchall Scholarship was worth \$8,000. The amounts can vary by year depending on the market investment returns on the funds on hand in Trust with the ACL. Full details of the scholarships are available on our Website at:

OCDT SHONOSKI RECEIVES ROSELLA BJORNSON AWARD

The Manitoba Chapter of the Ninety-Nines is pleased to announce HEATHER SHONOSKI as the 2007 winner of the Rosella Bjornson Scholarship. Heather has a Glider Pilot Instructor Licence and Private Pilot Licence and intends to use the scholarship towards her Night Rating. She received \$1000.00 to apply towards flight training and a membership to The Ninety-Nines, International Organization of Women Pilots.

The Manitoba Chapter of the 99's organizes a Poker Derby and undertakes other fund-raising activities to award a flying scholarship each year. The scholarship has been named after Rosella Bjornson as she was involved in organizing the Manitoba Chapter in 1972.

Rosella has been involved in many "firsts" in Canadian aviation history. By 1973, Rosella had 3,500 hours flying time, an Air Transport Rating and a Class I Multi-engine Instrument Rating, and applied to fly with the airlines. She was hired as a First Officer at Transair, the fourth largest airline in Canada. This gave her the distinction of being the first female to be hired as a First Officer in North America on scheduled jet operations, and the first female to be hired by a commercial air line in Canada. In the winter of 1990, Rosella became the first female Captain with Canadian Airlines International and the first woman to be promoted to Captain with a major Canadian air carrier. Rosella Bjornson was inducted as a Member of Canada's Aviation Hall of Fame in 1997.

GLIDING NEWS

Spring Familiarization Gliding is scheduled to start in early April with staff training in the first few weeks and with squadron flying commencing on April 26. Check out your dates on the schedule at www.aircadetmanitoba.com/gschedule.html.

The Provincial Committee has purchased a fifth SGS 2-33 glider, C-FWYJ, from the Regina Gliding Club with funds donated by the Air Canada Pilots Association. The glider will have to be processed through the Structure Inspection and Repair Program at the Gimli maintenance facility and could be ready sometime in 2009 if all goes well. Also we will be replacing the launch-winch tow vehicle in the next few weeks with funds from the Winnipeg Foundation. The replacement vehicle should permit us to rationalize our vehicle fleet and make adjustments that may reduce insurance costs.

We are looking forward to a successful Spring gliding season, subject to weather, but the real limiting factor in past seasons has been the reliability of squadrons to get their cadets out to the gliding Centres. Everyone must participate for success.
