Accordingly, application has been made to form a second squadron to parade in the St. Boniface Arts and Technology Centre that will be sponsored by the Squadron's Parents Committee with support from other community organizations. It is planned the new Squadron will parade on Thursday evenings.

Discussions are also ongoing with organizers for a potential squadron in the City of Steinbach. This initiative was started by former participants in the Air Cadet Program that now live in that community. Applications are being completed for forwarding to Ottawa for formal establishment.
