### 2007 NATIONAL ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

The sixty-sixth Annual General Meeting of the Air Cadet League of Canada was held in the Canad Inn Polo Park in Winnipeg from June 14 to 16, 2007. Over 100 members of the National and Provincial Organizations met to conduct the business of the League.

Committees met on Thursday preparing for the General Meeting. Friday featured the National Air Cadet Effective Speaking Competition in the morning followed by the Annual Awards Luncheon at which six Manitobans were recognized for their contributions: Mr. Roy Moir of 249 RCACS Beausejour, Mr. Claude Laferriere of 170 RCACS Winnipeg and Mr. Doug Rogers of 199 RCACS Winnipeg received the Air Cadet League Certificate of Merit. Lieutenant-Colonel Tom Szczerski, Lieutenant-Colonel Jim Forestell and Captain Alexis McCormick received the Air Cadet League Certificate of Recognition. While not all were present, those awards will be passed on at the Manitoba AGM in September.

The Manitoba Provincial Committee, as hosts of the event, sponsored a casual evening at the Assiniboine Downs which was recognized by the running of the Air Cadet League President's Purse.

The Annual General Meeting took place on Saturday at which Mr. Jan Reidulff of Manitoba was elected as First Vice-President. That evening the President's Dinner was held with Lieutenant-General Charles Bouchard, Commander 1 Canadian Air Division, as the Guest of Honour. The General spoke of his time as an Air Cadet and we will miss his strong support of the program when he leaves for his new posting in Colorado Springs. Following presentation of several senior awards, the retiring President, Mr. Craig Hawkins, passed on the President's Diamond Pin to President elect Mr. Michel Cataford. The 2008 meeting will be held in Quebec City.

This year was a first for the competition to involve a cadet from the Northwest Territory and also the Civil Air Patrol of the U.S.A. Chief Master Sergeant Justin McDowell from Fargo, ND spoke but not as a competitor. It is hoped that future years will see continued participation from other CAP cadets.

The Masters of Ceremonies were two previous Manitoba competitors Officer Cadet Heather Shonoski and Mr. Dana Gregoire. The Judges were members of Toastmasters' Clubs in Winnipeg.

#### AIR CADETS IN STONEWALL?

Stonewall Branch #52 of the Royal Canadian Legion held an open house on Sunday June 10, 2007 to introduce the Air Cadet Program to the citizens of that community. Legion representatives approached Cadet Detachment Winnipeg and the Manitoba Provincial Committee to determine the feasibility of resurrecting the #301 Alan McLeod Squadron that paraded in Stonewall from 1943 to 1948.

We are aware that a number of cadets from the Stonewall area parade with Winnipeg squadrons and therefore, the potential of developing a successful unit is excellent. The interest expressed by families who attended the open house was encouraging and the support from the Legion and community organizations is positive.

On Saturday the cadets visited the Western Canada Aviation Museum in the afternoon and attended a Goldeyes Baseball game in the evening as guests of the team.
