

MANITOBA'S NEWEST SQUADRON

Manitoba's twenty-second and Canada's newest Royal Canadian Air Cadet Squadron stood up in Winnipeg on August 29, 2003. The squadron, 199 (St. Vital) RCACS, is sponsored by the 199 RCACS Parents' Association, it will parade in the St. Boniface Arts and Technology Centre on Thursday evenings. The squadron evolved from 176 (Boeing of Canada) RCACS when it was determined that it was in the best interest of the cadets to operate two squadrons rather than the one very large unit. The Local Sponsor Committee Chair is Mr. Doug Rogers, whilst Major Jim Forestell, the previous Commanding Officer of 176 RCACS, has assumed Command of 199 RCACS. The new unit, the first to form in Winnipeg in over fifty years, has acquired the squadron number of the original St. Vital Squadron which formed in that community on November 7, 1942 and was later disbanded on November 18, 1946. There are a total of 445 Air Cadet Squadrons in communities throughout Canada.

2003 ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

RECRUITING AND RETENTION

One of the objectives of DND and the ACLC is to increase the Air Cadet population nationally by ten percent each year over the next period of years until we achieve a population of approximately 35,000. In concert with this goal. Manitoba squadrons were challenged to grow by ten percent last year. Three of our squadrons achieved that objective: 82 RCACS Brandon; 182 RCACS Gimli; and 249 RCACS Beauseiour met or exceeded their goals and have received a certificate recognizing their accomplishment. Well done!

There are several benefits to growth; such as increased Summer Training slots and increased funding grants; these squadrons will benefit accordingly. Four other squadrons were very close to their objectives and hopefully they will achieve the mark this year. The challenge is now for our other squadrons to help meet the national goal. It is recognized that there are limitations to growth at some locations but these are the minority. Squadrons will be challenged again this training year and their objectives will be passed to them in November.

SQUADRON ANNIVERSARIES

Congratulations are extended to three of our Manitoba Squadrons that are celebrating anniversaries this Training Year: Strathclair's 317 RCACS is celebrating 60 years of continuous operation; 317 officially formed on 25 August 1943. 50 RCACS Dauphin, which originally formed on November 25, 1941 but disbanded in 1948, was reformed on 6 August 1953, and along with 575 RCACS Portage La Prairie. which stood up on 2 September 1953, are celebrating their 50th year of operation.
