2007 APPLICATIONS - NATIONAL SUMMER TRAINING COURSES

INTRODUCTION

The Executive Director of the Air Cadet League (ACL) of Canada and the Senior Staff Officer of Air Cadets have agreed that the following procedures will be used for Air cadets applying for National Summer Training Courses. The Directorate of Cadets (D Cdts) will advise Regional Cadet Support Units (RCSUs) of these procedures.

The purpose of this article is to assist Air Cadet Squadrons in the preparation and submission of applications for National Summer Training Courses. Sponsoring Committee Chairpersons and Squadron Commanding Officers are asked to jointly read the following information and instructions carefully and to make sure, together, that all potential candidates are made fully aware of what is required.

APPLICATION FORMS

Form DND 2226, Air Cadet Summer Training Application, is the form to be used by a cadet applying for a National Summer Training Course. The distribution of the forms shall be directed to each squadron at the beginning of October. Upon receipt of the **new** form DND 2226 (06-2006), immediately destroy the **old** form DND 2226 (07-2005).

APPLICATION DEADLINE RESPONSIBILITIES

Candidates are responsible for filling out the application form completely and submitting all the required documents.

Parents/Guardians are responsible for confirming that all information provided by their son/daughter/ward is correct.

LHQ TRAINING PROGRAM PROFICIENCY LEVEL AND ENROLMENT DATE

It is essential that the stated current proficiency level of the candidate is **possibly achievable** when the enrolment date is taken into account. Please note that only cadets joining at 14 years of age or older may accelerate training, by combining Levels 1 and 2. **Other proficiency levels cannot be combined.** See CATO 54-10 for details.

AGE LIMIT FOR ALL COURSES

In previous years, the instructions given for the International Air Cadet Exchange (IACE), Power Pilot Scholarship (PPS), Glider Pilot Scholarship (GPS) and Air Traffic Control Course (ATCC) concerning the age limit was that a cadet could not turn 19 before September 1st. Courses ending in August every year meant that 18 years old cadets turning 19 between the end of the course and September 1st were not eligible to apply for a course even if they were 18 for the entire length of the course.

The age limit for all courses has now been changed. Cadets, who will turn 19 after the end of the course

including travel time from the Cadet Summer Training Centre (CSTC)/Regional Gliding School (RGS) to return to their home unit, may now submit an application.

Specific dates concerning age requirement for each course and the departure dates scheduled at the different CSTCs and RGSs known at this time are available on the Manitoba League web site www.aircadetleague.com/manitoba. These dates should not change and they shall be used to determine the eligibility of a cadet to submit an application for a specific course. Exceptionally, a departure date for a given course may change for valid reasons. In this case, you will be advised immediately and the eligibility of a cadet to participate on that particular course will be determined in accordance with the updated departure date.

Waivers will not be considered and any procedure to circumvent the age limit rule will not be authorized.

After a course has started, it is possible that it may be extended past the scheduled departure date for valid reasons, primarily for bad weather conditions at a PPS/GPS location. Any cadet turning 19 in that extended period shall be returned to his home unit the day before he turns 19. For the PPS/GPS, the ACL and the Department of National Defence (DND) shall not be responsible for any cost incurred by ex-cadets if they decide to complete the course with civilian organizations after their departure from the RGS.

SELECTED CADETS VS EMPLOYMENT/STAFF CADET OPPORTUNITY AT A CSTC

Cadets who have applied for a National Summer Training Course will not be offered employment as a civilian instructor or a staff cadet advanced training opportunity at a CSTC before the Merit Lists submitted by the Provincial Committees/RCSUs are confirmed as OFFICIAL by the National Selection Committee for the IACE and by the Regional Air Training Officers for all other courses. After this announcement, cadets who have been SELECTED for a National Summer Training Course will not be offered employment as a civilian instructor or a staff cadet advanced training opportunity at a CSTC.

Cadets who have **not been selected** and find themselves on the **SPARES** lists for National Summer Training Courses **may be offered** an employment as a civilian instructor or a staff cadet advanced training opportunity at a CSTC, **if they also applied for such opportunities**. A cadet's acceptance of employment as civilian instructor or a staff cadet advanced training opportunity at a CSTC does not affect in any way his chance of obtaining the course he applied for, as he remains a spare for that course. If a position becomes available and he is the highest-ranking spare, he **will have the option** of accepting the course applied for or keep the employment as a civilian instructor or staff cadet position already offered.
