

2011 ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING MESSAGE FROM NEW CHAIRPERSON

Greetings from the Air Cadet League of Canada (Manitoba), Inc. Board of Directors. As you will be aware, we recently held our Annual General Meeting (AGM), at which I was honoured to be elected the Board Chairman. I would like to take this time to say that your new Board will pledge to serve the Royal Canadian Air Cadet Squadrons, their Officers, and the Sponsoring Committees (SSCs) to the best of our abilities, to ensure that the most important people, the Cadets themselves, are able to take full advantage of all of the programmes, services and opportunities that the Air Cadet movement offers to the future leaders of Canada.

To these ends, I want to ensure that all of you are well served, and that your issues are heard by the Board, and resolved to the satisfaction of all. To do this, we

must communicate with each other, whether by email, letters, or face-to-face when able. I realize that some Squadrons, because of geography, will have an easier time of doing the latter. However, the technology exists to allow us to communicate more effectively than we may have in the past, and we will use it to our advantage. Therefore, I have tasked one of my Board committees to examine the use of teleconferencing, video conferencing and Skype, as well as any other such technology, to bring us closer together and allow us to exchange ideas and plans for the way ahead in a more efficient manner. This would, for example, allow our most Northern Squadrons to "attend" our monthly Board meetings, our semi-annual meetings and even our future AGMs, as we know it is somewhat difficult at times to travel to the meeting sites. As well, technology will allow us to address any Squadron's issues "face-to-face" in a reasonable timeline. I am excited about this, and I very much look forward to having all 24 Manitoba Squadrons, their COs and SSCs together with me and my Board for regular meetings and discussions. We will set up this electronic system, hopefully much sooner than later, and my Board members will be contacting you on the details and requirements to bring it to fruition. Notwithstanding the electronic means available to us, you will be most welcome to attend any of our meetings in person, should you be in Winnipeg for any reason.

I re-iterate to you the importance, in my opinion, of the need to communicate often with each other to ensure that all your issues are addressed. I know that you will all receive the minutes and other documentation from our recent AGM - if there is something in the records of decisions that you do not understand or agree with, let us know, and we will ensure that you have a complete understanding of the rationale behind it.

CANADIAN COUNCIL FOR AVIATION & AEROSPACE

The Canadian Aviation Maintenance Council (CAMC) has changed its name to the **Canadian Council for Aviation & Aerospace (CCAA)**. The change reflects the Council's work in segments of the industry beyond aviation maintenance. As a national sector council, CCAA's focus is on skills development and demographic (human-resource) issues for the entire Canadian aviation and aerospace industry.

The Council, which are strong supporters of the Air Cadet Program, recently held their 2011 convention in Winnipeg, to which several Air Cadets were invited to observe the activities.
